

YOUR FENCING GUIDE

All our fence panels have been designed and manufactured with care and attention to be the perfect addition to your garden. To ensure you do get the best out of your new fencing and to increase the longevity we advise that you read this fencing guide. Thank you for choosing a Mercia Garden product!

Treating your fencing

Once installed, your fencing will require treating as soon as possible and annually, in a colour of your choice, to prevent the timber from deteriorating and to waterproof it.

Dip Treated fencing - Requires a preservative treatment to protect against rot and decay and will also require a coat of waterproof treatment. Your fencing will require both treatments initially and annually.

Pressure Treated fencing - Although your fencing is protected from rot and decay, we recommend the application of a waterproof treatment once installed and annually thereafter.

Please keep a record of when you have treated your fencing and the treatment used so that in the unlikely event your fencing develops rot, we can validate your guarantee.

General Maintenance

As wood is a natural product it may be affected by the following:

Splits, cracks & knots - Small splits, cracks or holes may appear in some timber where knots shrink and fall out. This will not effect the structure of your fencing however if you wish to fill them this can be easily done using any good quality wood filler.

Damp & mould - Moisture can form on your fencing and if not in a position where it can dry out, this can cause damp and mould to grow on your fencing. If mould or mildew do start to form we recommend using an anti-mould cleaner to remove it and to prevent it spreading.

Sap - is naturally occurring in wood and may appear on some parts of your timber fencing. If you wish to remove the sap, we advise waiting until it is dry and then using a sharp knife to carefully remove it.
